Irena Martínková is Associate Professor in Kinanthropology at the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport, Charles University, Prague, Czech Republic, focusing on Philosophy of Sport and Ethics of Sport.

She is currently Chair of the Faculty Ethics Committee, and Vice-Chair of the European Association for the Philosophy of Sport.

She is the author of *Instrumentality and Values in Sport* (Karolinum Press, 2013) and co-editor of *Phenomenological Approaches to the Study of Sport* (Routledge, 2012), and has published numerous chapters and journal articles on sport within the areas of phenomenology, values in sport, sex/gender and discrimination in sport, sport categorisation, Olympism, martial arts and Eastern thinking.

She attended the 1999 edition of the IOA PG Seminar and has since returned many times as guest professor.

Jim Parry is Visiting Professor at the Faculty of Physical Education and Sport, Charles University in Prague; formerly Head of the Department of Philosophy, University of Leeds, UK.

His main academic interests are in sports ethics and social and political philosophy. He is co-author of *The Olympic Games Explained* (2005), *Sport and Spirituality* (2007) and *Olympic Values and Ethics in Contemporary Society* (2012); and co-editor of *Ethics and Sport* (1998), *Olympic Ethics and Philosophy* (2012), *Fields of Vision – the Arts in Sport* (2014), *Ethics and Governance in Sport* (2016), *Body Ecology and Emersive Leisure* (2018) and *Experiential Learning and Outdoor Education* (2019).

He is a former Chair of the British Universities Physical Education Association and Founding Director of the British Olympic Academy.

He has been Visiting Professor of Olympic Studies in Barcelona, Ghent, Ancient Olympia, London and Sochi.
